Job Summary

The primary responsibility of this position is the day-to-day operations pertaining to credit courses included in the Workforce and Economic Development Division.

- 3. Advises and helps to register students for upcoming semesters.
- 4. Uses content outlines to direct learning, providing lesson plans and course outcomes.
- 5. Demonstrates high standards, both academic and professional.
- 6. Evaluates student work constructively and provides timely feedback.
- 7. Reviews, evaluates, and recommends student learning materials.
- 8. Develops and uses a syllabus and course information material for each course, laboratory, or clinical setting.
- 9. Teaches both theoretical and practical learning experiences.
- 10. Selects and maintains appropriate materials, audiovisuals and equipment to enhance student education.
- 11. Directs, guides and evaluates student performance in a laboratory setting.
- 12. Maintains a positive learning environment.
- 13. Maintain student records pertaining to the program.
- 14. Reviews, evaluates, and revises program curricula and teaching methods.
- 15. Submits recommendations related to budget and purchases.
- 16. Performs all other functions necessary for the proper operation of assigned courses.
